

## **Ethical Conduct**

AIAA realizes that the Regional Student Paper Conferences are a learning experience. One very important aspect of writing a technical paper is the adherence to ethical conduct.

The AIAA Board of Directors advise:

***3.1 The AIAA member will take care that credit for professional work is given to those to whom credit is properly due.***

AIAA Technical Papers expects our authors to operate in an ethical way.

Our copyright statement clearly states what is acceptable and unacceptable in order for a technical paper to be published with AIAA:

The work must be UNCLASSIFIED and has been cleared and approved for public release by the appropriate company and/or government agencies.

The author must assure us that their material contains no copyright-infringing material. Their material must either be original work by the author(s), with no portion of the material covered by a prior copyright. For any portion that is copyrighted, the author must obtain permission for its use, in writing, and provide to AIAA for their records. The work cannot infringe any trademark, patent, trade secret, or other intellectual property rights of any person, and cannot contain any material that is defamatory.

Lastly, the work cannot have been published, or undergoing consideration for publication elsewhere (with the allowed exception of publication in a different format by AIAA).
